Introduction to the Competition

The Vancouver International Piano Competition is organized by the Beijing Youth Art Development Special Fund, authorized by the Canadian Pianists Association, with support from the Beijing Runhe Public Welfare Foundation, and managed by Squirrel Muse (Beijing) Cultural Co., Ltd. The competition invites authoritative piano professors from top music institutions both domestically and internationally, as well as renowned international piano performers, to form the judging panel. Through high-level piano competitions and rich academic exchange activities, the competition aims to provide a platform for young piano enthusiasts to showcase their talents, engage in mutual exchange, enrich their knowledge, and broaden their horizons.

During the China regional finals, many professors from the judging panel will personally participate in various academic exchange activities, including master classes, public classes, learning exchanges, concerts, etc. This allows the participants to closely interact with well-known pianists, continuously improve their piano performance skills, enhance their artistic literacy, and plan the development path of their performances. Simultaneously, the competition is committed to discovering and nurturing cutting-edge piano artistic talents, providing them with opportunities to realize their dreams and embark on the artistic journey towards the international stage.

Recording requirements:

- (1) Please use the built-in recording function of your camera or mobile phone to shoot a horizontal screen video, and fix a camera position on the right side of the performer to ensure that the performer's whole body is in the camera, and the hand movements and face are clearly visible.
- (2) The video recording for the competition should be continuous and complete without editing. If external recording equipment is used, the audio and video must be synchronized.
- (3) The video is recorded and the players perform directly. Information that affects the fairness of the competition, such as personal names, push units, instructors, etc. shall not be reflected in the video.
- (4) The resolution is 1080P and above, the video file format is MP4 or MOV, and the video size must not exceed 2G.
- (5) The submitted works must be videos recorded within 6 months before the registration deadline.

Registration Guidelines for the International Grand Finals and Music Festival:

1.Registration Period:

- (1) Music Festival (free participation in the International Grand Finals after qualifying): From now until May 31st, 2024
- •(2) Registration for the International Grand Finals only: May 15th, 2024, to May 31st, 2024, Participants who have won the second prize or above in the U.S. division are eligible to register for the International Grand Finals.
- •Note: Students who did not qualify or did not participate in the competition can still register for the Music Festival. Participants who qualify for the International Grand Finals through the Music Festival are eligible for free participation.

- (1) Music Festival (including the International Grand Finals): July 21st-30th, 2024, on-site in Vancouver, Canada
- •(2) International Grand Finals: July 26th-27th, 2024, on-site in Vancouver, Canada

These awards can be used to offset the registration fees for participating in the current Music Festival. (Players ranked 1st, 2nd, and 3rd correspond to the first, second, and third prize winners, respectively, and their rankings do not exceed the respective prize levels).
